Item 2023-8-05: Circular Materials NB Stewardship Plan for Packaging and Paper

Jeff McCallum, Managing Director of Circular Materials presented the presentation via Zoom.

Marcel Caissie, Supply Chain Specialist, Josh Lewis, Field Service Rep and Dan Lantz, Strategic Advisor were also on the call.

Circular Materials is a national not-for-profit producer responsibility organization that serves, represents, and supports producers in building more efficient recycling systems across Canada. These services include collection, management, promotion, education, and reporting.

By extending producer responsibility to end-of-life management, EPR policies link the costs of collecting and managing products and packaging to those supplying the products and packaging in the form of producer fees. This encourages producers to consider how to meet recycling targets for materials by using packaging that is recyclable.

Throughout 2022, Circular Materials developed and consulted on a New Brunswick Stewardship Plan for Packaging and Paper on behalf of brand owners obligated by the Designated Materials Regulation under the *Clean Environment Act*. As per the Stewardship Plan, transition of existing residential curbside recycling programs will be completed in 2024.

On May 5th, 2023, Recycle NB approved the Stewardship Plan, which kickstarted the transition to the new program beginning on November 1st, 2023, for the western part of the province. The remaining regions will move to the Circular Materials model on May 1st, 2024. Circular Materials will contact the municipalities/RSCs to seek the intention to opt-in or opt-out of contracting with Circular Materials.

There will be a two-phase rollout. The GMRSC rollout is in Phase 2 of the plan *(Group 2)*. On May 1, 2024, curbside collection will begin for those that accept the offer from Circular Materials.

What happens when a municipality opts-in or opts-out?

Where the Entity opts-in:

Entity that signs the Service Agreement Contract with Circular Materials will be responsible for the following:

- Engage in a contract with the collection service provider.
- Administer the collection contract and be responsible for customer service.
- Manage Public Education (P&E) with support from Circular Materials, and a topup will be provided for P&E and contract administration.

Circular Materials will base the payment to each Entity on a set cost per stop.

Where the Entity opts-out:

If the Entity declines to sign the Service Agreement Contract, Circular Materials will be responsible for the following:

- Negotiate directly with a collection service provider.
- Administer the collection contract.
- Circular Materials will directly lead P&E.

Payment for collection will defer six months to allow Circular Materials to negotiate with a collection service provider. The collection service provider will be responsible for customer service.

Mayor Lordon was interested in hearing more about the financial cost and penalties of the program. He said he was not ready to make any financial decisions at this time.

<u>Item 2023-8-06: GMRSC Regional Strategy (Final) – Presentation from Portfolio Solutions Group</u>

Mike Randall of Portfolio Solutions Group presented the revised GMRSC Regional Strategy for 2023-2028.

The revised Regional Strategy was presented based on prior IN CAMERA meetings with the GMRSC Board members and changes that were suggested by the Board and GMRSC Staff.

With Local Governance Reform, the GMRSC has the obligation, according to regulation, to develop a comprehensive Regional Strategy aimed at identifying the strengths and gaps in the region and at establishing priorities and actions, especially in respect to the additional mandate functions, to provide direction for the board of directors for the next 5 years.

The Regional Strategy includes the following:

- A three-year operational Work Plan that Commission staff can use and refer to achieve the objectives of the Regional Strategy
- The framework for a Communications Plan
- The framework for a Communications Plan that outlines the preferred approach to communicate to residents, stakeholders, local governments, and others the services provided by the GMRSC, how these are delivered, and generally the mandate of the Commission as a service provider.
- A minimum 2-page standalone infographic that is written in plain language along with the final report for circulation to the public and stakeholder groups in the Miramichi Region.
